St. Paul's Letter to the Romans

Session 8 Topic: Romans Chapters 9 to 11

Study Questions:

- 1. Paul looks at the challenges that the children of Abraham have in accessing God's favour and blessings in *Romans 9: 3-7*. Is there a difference in being a child of the promise or a child of the flesh? If so, what is it, and how should that affect us?
- 2. Chapter 9 shows how God can use the younger or weaker parties for his good works and redemption, because of their faith. Why is that and what does it mean?
- 3. The video talks about how the law and Jesus can appear to contradict each other, then uses an analogy about waiting for desert or a traffic light. Does God want us to do different things at different times? How is God's mercy at work in this?
- 4. Has God created a new Israel from the Gentiles because of the Jew's failures? Paul suggests, the faithful remnant of Israel is open to God's guidance and grace. How should this teaching shape us as followers of Jesus?
- 5. Chapter 11 ends with Paul recounting how God is always and still at work, healing and blessing creation. How do we praise God or show our thanks for this?
